**12. Community Grant Applications (Max £1500)**

The Town Council have received a Community Grant Application from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Warwick Sea Scouts for the sum of £1500 towards the purchase of two FEVA sailing Dinghies whose overall cost is some £10,800.

**13. Community Support Applications (Max £5000)**

We have received a Community Support Application from Warwick District Citizens' Advice Bureau for the sum of £5000 towards the general operation cost of running the Various projects targeted at people not getting help with the problems they face. The 'Warwick Advice' service will deliver a targeted programme of home based advice and support. They have also confirmed £2000 from Orbit Heart of England and are applying to the King Henry VIII Endowed Trust.

A Community Support application has been received from The Really Youthful Theatre Company who are looking for funding of £1960 towards a young people's Drama Club based at Aylesford School and run by young people themselves with a professional mentoring team in place to run the club as part of an Apprenticeship programme. The request is based on two terms fees of 14 students at £70 per head. The students will look to fundraise for the final term.

A Community Support Application has been received from Newburgh School's Parent Group Charity requesting £5000 towards the purchase & installation of an outdoor performance stage & seating area. They have raised funds via a school 'Skipathon' of £1400 but the overall project which includes benches and artificial grass totals £6071.30 They are hoping to raise another £1500 from their Summer Fair next month.
