make available to the community. However, due to lock down we have not been able to raise any funds via events and we even had to cancel the Annual Heritage day which was a huge disappointment to us all.

However, we are determined to open the site up to the community on a more frequent basis as soon as we possibly can, for youth groups, scouts, schools, nature/historic walks, volunteers, GoodGym, picnics, etc. It is true to say that most of our volunteers would be socially isolated if it were not for Guys Cliffe.

We are using the period of lockdown to finalise work started before on safety, accessibility and security, but we have totally run out of funding now and have no income at all the moment. Do you think there may be any funding we could apply for so we can be ready the minute we are able to let people in. We need gravel and/or self-bind aggregate to make selected parts of the footpaths easier for less mobile people and some additional fencing along the way, for extra safety

How do you know there is a need for the work covered by your grant application?

At our last Heritage Open Day in 2019 we had the highest footfall of any of the local venues. We had more than a thousand of visitors. We had plans for this year to host local school children for educational picnics with their teachers for an educational tour of the historical site, camping weekend for scouts, Heritage day as well as regular open days for wider community, training day for Warwickshire Search and Rescue etc. . The site dates back to as early as the **5th century**. It boasts a 15th century chapel, a cliff certified as a Site of Special Scientific Interest. The site takes its name from Legendary Guy of Warwick The ruined mansion has links to Henry VIII, Elizabeth I and to various names such as Percy, Greatheed, Beauchamp and Piers Gaveston. During WWI the house was used as a hospital and later in WWII as a school for evacuated children. In latter years it has been destroyed by fire and neglect, althoughthe 15th century chapel has been well maintained and the ruin made stable
