We are seeking funding for our Warwick CV34 Family Wellbeing Pathway.

Through funding from the charity of Thomas Oaken and Nicholas Eyffler which commenced in September 2020, we have been delivering our Warwick Family Wellbeing Pathway, which includes 1-1 counselling for parents up to 18 sessions, Family Wellbeing Support which provides families with direct support, parenting programmes, emotional support, advocacy, signposting and referrals to other appropriate organisations. Group Work, which includes baby massage, parenting groups and also friendship groups, resiliance groups, beating anxiety and lego based therapy for school aged children. Parent Mentoring, our Mentors are volunteers who offer emotional and practical support with families.

The services are being delivered in a blended approach to suit the client, therefore it may be face to face, via telephone or zoom. We have access to community venues in Warwick where we meet with families and they are able to access counselling at the venue. For Example Westgate Children and Families Centre, The Gap and Packmores Centre.

We have good working relationships with a number of Warwick Primary school's, Aylesford school and Myton school, who are accessing our friendship groups, resilience groups, lego based therapy and Positive Relationships groups.

We are seeking funding to enable us to increase capacity within the Pathway. At our last 6 month review with the charity of Thomas Oken and Nicholas Eyffler in March 2023, we identified that we are exceeding targets and holding waiting for parents to access counselling and for a Parent Mentor.

The work in schools has greatly exceeded our expectations and local schools are requesting additional groups, due to the high level of need being demonstrated by pupils who have been impacted by the disruption of the Pandemic, periods of isolation and lack of routine with respect to accessing school and socialising with peers. We have needed to be in schools for 4/5 hours a week to deliver groups, to support children in accessing school, explore anxiety, bullying and mental health.

Demand for the pathway by profressionals and parents has far exceded our expectations, due in part to the impact of the Covid 19 Pandemic and the current cost of living crisis which is extremely challenging and has impacted families significantly due to increased pressure on: finances, debt, housing, anxiety, mental health, pressure on employment, mangaing children's behaviour, break down in relationships.

We have had an unprecedented increase in numbers of parents who are presenting with suicide ideation, and self harm. In March 2023 we identified that 47% of parents in counselling have current or historical ideation of suicide, we are counselling parents who are activly planning suicude and cite that counselling is supporting them to consider they have a future.

How do you know there is a need for the work covered by your grant application?

Describe the evidence you have got and the source (e.g survey, statistical data etc)

Mind and NHS research in 2019 stated that 1 in 4 parents experience mental health which impacts their own and their families' mental health and wellbeing, The NSPCC helpline between April 2020 and January 2021 received a 44% increase in calls, from adults about paternal mental health.

1 in 6 school aged children now have a diagnosable mental health disorder, an increase from 1 in 9 in 2017 (NHS study 2021). Effective support from an early stage not only helps children and young people cope with challenging life circumstances, but can also prevent problems from escalating and becoming more serious in adolescence and adulthood.

The foodbank in Warwick District gave out over 7350, 3 day food parcels in 2021, 1 in 5 people in the UK live below the poverty line.

The number of children in England needing treatment for serious mental health problems has risen by 39% in a year. Within NHS research they have identified that the pandemic, social inequality, austerity and online harm are all fuelling a crisis in which NHS, mental health treatment referrals for under-18s have increased to more than 1.1m in 2021-22. The figures include children who are suicidal, self-harming, suffering serious depression or anxiety, and those with eating disorders.

Within the Parenting Project we are supporting an unpresented amount of parents, children and young people for whom Mental Health is having a significant impact on their daily lives, lived experience and outcomes.

Within our monitoring report of the Family Wellbeing Pathway delivery in Warwick we have identified the following areas:

Domestic abuse is hith in the area and continues to rise.

47% parents in counselling have had ideas of suicide and selfharm. (March 2023)

The amount of time we need to support families is longer due to complexity.

Historic childhood trauma and abuse is present in the majority of parent's experiences.

High levels of intergenerational trauma, impact of parents trauma on their own children. In counselling over half of the parents experienced trauma / neglect or abuse.

Children/teenagers are displaying difficult behaviours, including anger, poor communication, fear, isolation and aggression. % of parents in counselling shared that their own children experience mental health issues/CAMHS/Diagnosis. The majority of families we are working and live in rented accommodation.

Difficult situations have worsened because of the pandemic, the full impact of the pandemic is still being understood from a Mental Health perspective.

Demand for support through the pathway is higher than expected, we have exceeded targets and are holding waiting lists for Counselling and Parent Mentors.

Schools have responded well to our group work and are requesting additional sessions, due to the high levels of need being presented by children, following the disruption of the pandemic.

Partnership Working

v/ What other partners are involved in the project and what are their contributions? Referrals to the Parenting Project are received from Parents, Social Care, Early Help Team, Targeted Services, Perinatal Mental Health Team, Health Visitors, Family Information Service, IAPT/RISE, Strengthening Families Team, Schools, voluntary organisation's; Barnardo's, The Gap, Social Prescribers. Parents also self refer.

Through the development of the Family Wellbeing Pathway in Warwick, we have dedicated time to share information about the service with key professionals and organisations, attending network meetings, team meetings, emailing and having phone conversations with professionals. We also share fliers which have been directly distributed to families.
